The primary objective of this seminar is to explore the formidable challenges to the internal security of India. A multi ethnolinguistic country like India faces challenges like safeguarding the internal security of its citizens and providing them a congenial environment by securing their physical, political, cultural identities and ensuring all round development of their personalities.

Major socio economic and political issues worsening the current situation of internal security are cross border terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir (J&K), rise of contentious politics based on caste, community, ethnic, linguistic or other divisive criteria. In addition, a number of secessionist movements are operating in India with demands ranging from autonomy, statehood and sometimes secession from the Indian Union. Ever since independence, India is also facing violent conflicts and communal riots based on different regional loyalties. Other reasons include, the uneven development of the country, fuelling problems like regionalism and communalism. The international forces actively interfering in the internal issues of India also malign the scene by providing material and ideological support to different ethnic stocks aggrieved by the state for not providing adequate socio economic development. The current geo political situation has also added environmental degradation and cyber security to the aforementioned list of issues. Organised crimes on civilians pose yet another challenge to the country's internal security.

Strategically, politically and economically North East is the most sensitive part of the country, linked with Indian heartland through a 21 km. wide Siliguri Corridor, flanked by Bhutan, Bangladesh and Nepal. It is one of the most extremely diverse and strategically sensitive regions of the land where lies different reasons for the ethnic upsurges and insurgencies. The lack of physical, cultural and emotional links has encouraged a feeling of alienation with the mainland. Large influx of migrants from neighbouring countries has aggravated a sense of insecurity among the local ethnic stocks.

Left wing extremism, also known by various other names such as Naxalism and Maoism, is a form of armed

insurgency against the State motivated by leftist ideologies. The rising Left Wing Extremism (LWE) in India is based on the idea of carving out a corridor from Tirupati (temple) in Tamil Nadu to Pashupati (temple) in Nepal.

The geo political location of our country in between the two global opium producing areas, namely 'Golden Crescent', and the 'Golden Triangle' poses yet another threat to our security.

The current seminar will provide a national platform to discuss different issues of internal security and delibrate upon viable solutions by striking a right balance between political, economic, social, environmental, geo political and other domains.

Themes proposed for the seminar

- 1. Insurgency in North East India and related issues of internal security
- 2. Terrorism, terrorist financing and its changing dimensions
- 3. Left Wing Extremism in India
- 4. Demands of autonomy, statehood and secession from the Union of India
